ATR VERDICT: Dermot McLaughlin may have found the ideal opportunity for his Irish raider CAPTAIN CJ, who has useful form behind the high-class Carefully Selected in both bumper and hurdle events and got within two lengths of Cap York at Navan in December, with that rival going on to perform respectably in Graded contests. Shaman Du Berlais looked the most likely winner when falling at the second-last obstacle at Catterick last time and Tim Vaughan's six-year-old could pick up some compensation here, while Largy Prospect was an easy winner at Ayr earlier this month and could progress again stepping up in trip.
