Battle Of Ideas was a brave winner at Newton Abbot last month and is respected off a 5lb higher mark, while Little Windmill and Elkstone both have useful course form and are respected. Iskabeg Lane has gone close the last twice and is another to consider at a venue that should suit his prominent tactics.
