





ATR VERDICT: FLAVIUS TITUS ran too badly for it to be true at Goodwood in the ultra-competitive Stewards' Cup at Goodwood six weeks ago and could bounce back at a track where his connections have had plenty of success in the past. The four-year-old previously looked progressive when scoring twice at Newmarket on fast ground and would prove tough to stop if returning to that sort of form. Citron Major has proved a revelation this season and wasn't disgraced when third in the Great St Wilfrid at Ripon behind a winner who has since scored again twice, while Enjazaat drops in class and could be good enough for third.
