<b>Expert View:</b> Made a bit too much use of up in trip and did not get home when third, beaten 16l, in a handicap chase here on his most recent run. Trainer in form and off a short break; effective around 2m on good to soft and good, and can do better if ridden more conservatively. 						(Forecast 7/1)

**EXPERT VIEW:** Debut winner JUBY BALL was beaten by a useful rival who got his jumping together last time and looks well treated back in a handicap. He looked the likely winner when coming down late off this mark on his penultimate start and the step back up in trip will be in his favour. He can defeat The Four Sixes who has been progressing over fences now he's brushed up on his jumping and looks on a good mark based on his spring hurdles form. Bumper and hurdles winner Willmount produced improved form on his last chase run where he was just outstayed late over 3m. He isn't ruled out either in a tight contest.
